### Hearing Procedure

- Curfew Administrative Citations
  - Municipal Code § 25.03.460



# Hearing Procedure (cont'd)

- Standard of Review: De Novo (brand new)
- Informal hearing
- Relevant evidence
- Oral testimony under oath
- Witnesses, documents and physical evidence
- Recorded by audiotape
- Chair decides on hearing length and procedural issues = FINAL



# Hearing Procedure (cont'd)

- 6 votes needed
  - Municipal Code §§ 2.08.090, 2.08.410
  - Commission Rule 406
- < 6 votes = Director's decision upheld</p>



# Hearing Procedure (cont'd)

- Commission's Decision = FINAL
- Written Decision → Citation Recipient
  - Curfew Administrative Citations
    - Municipal Code § 25.03.470.E



### **Decision Options**

- Curfew Administrative Citations
  - Uphold or Cancel Administrative Citation
  - Municipal Code § 25.03.470.A
- List reasons for decision



#### **Curfew Administrative Citations**

- SJC Curfew
  - No aircraft operations 11:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.
  - Municipal Code §§ 25.03.220, 25.03.225
- Administrative Citation Fine = \$2,500 per violation
  - Amount set by ordinance
    - Municipal Code § 25.03.420
  - No discretion as to fine amount



## **Curfew Exemptions**

- Curfew Exemptions = Cancel Citation
  - \* Force Majeure Event \*
    - Municipal Code §§ 25.03.320, 25.03.245
  - Government-Operated Aircraft
    - Municipal Code § 25.03.330
  - Grandfathered Aircraft
    - Municipal Code § 25.03.255

### Force Majeure Event defined

- Force Majeure Event: Event beyond pilot's control that delay aircraft operation, including
  - Unforeseen mechanical problems
  - FAA Air Traffic Control directives
  - Compliance with federal, state or local security directives
  - Weather-related impacts



### Force Majeure Event defined

- Force Majeure Event: Events beyond pilot's control, including
  - Weather factors
  - Unscheduled closure at scheduled destination airport (not SJC)
  - Emergency to preserve life or property
  - Emergency operations during official federal, state or city emergency
